## BIOMASS BURNING IS BAD FOR THE ECONOMY AND POOR JOB CREATION VEHICLE

- Subsidizing biomass incinerators that burn trees and garbage to make electricity is <u>bad energy policy and a bad investment</u> because they:
  - cause asthma, cancer, heart disease and other illnesses and will drive up health care costs
  - emit 50% more carbon dioxide than coal per megawatt and make climate change worse
  - o are **not carbon neutral** energy sources
- We already get 50% of our so called "clean and green" energy from dirty, polluting biomass incinerators taxpayers and rate payers don't want more
- Incinerators are a <u>poor job creation vehicle</u>:
  - The 20 permanent jobs over the 30 year life of the plant costs the public \$3.5 million per job<sup>1</sup>
  - Instead, direct "Green job" funding to "cash for caulkers" conservation and efficiency
  - o International Brotherhood of Teamsters opposes waste incinerators
  - Short term construction jobs must be balanced against long term public health impacts from toxic air pollution 24/7/365 for 30 years

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The typical 50 MW plant costs about \$200 million to build and at least 1/3 will be paid for via cash grants under the ARRA (2009 Stimulus Bill) or investment tax credits. That's \$70 million in taxpayer dollars for 20 permanent jobs – about \$3.5 million per job.
