

## MSWE Development Update – Steering Team Meeting 3-11-11

- a. The MSWE Project is beginning to generate interest around the country; recently the team was contacted by Mr. Edward Laster a representative of an organization called Zero Waste.
2. The team was also had the opportunity to meet with Michael R. Kiehl, Sr, Manager, Business Development, Honeywell Process Solutions.
  - a. Upon meeting with Mr. Kiehl, the team learned that his sector of Honeywell specializes in energy managing projects.
  - b. He then gave us a presentation that gave a broad overview of some of the many Ethernet connection devices that we can use in order to seamlessly integrate our systems.
  - c. As the project progresses we plan to continue to have more discussions with Mr. Kiehl regarding many of the systems that Honeywell may be able to provide for our project.
3. On January 19, 2011, the team attended the Advanced Energy Industry Cluster Road mapping Workshop hosted by Nortech.
  - a. During this event the team was able to participate in many discussions with a number of advanced energy experts from across the country.
  - b. Those presenters include:
    - i. Marco Castaldi – Dept. of Earth and Environmental Engineering at Columbia University (Waste Utilization and America’s Energy and Chemical Production Opportunity);
    - ii. Paul Hauck – Camp Dresser McKee Inc. (Biomass Material for Production of Renewable Energy and Bio-fuels);
    - iii. Ned Stowe – Environmental and Energy Study Institute (Overview of the Bio Energy Policy Landscape: Current Status, Future Trends)
4. The MSWE Development team also continues to have their monthly meetings with PEG in order to ensure progression of the deliverables.

- a. During these meetings the team, the City's law department and PEG and its consultants reviewed, commented and made the necessary changes to the Air Permit Application
5. The team is still observing available grants for the first and second quarter from the Ohio Department of Development for 2011.
